



You may use the Venn Diagram, or a different graphic organizer to help you identify similarities and differences in the two men's viewpoints.



STEP 4: PICK AN STRUCTURE FOR YOUR ESSAY

You have 2 options to pick from:



Bock Pattern

You focus on the person completely and discuss all of its points before moving on to compare and contrast it to the second person.




Point-by-Point Pattern



You focus on one point at a time. As you discuss each point, you compare and/or contrast the two people focusing on one point. Then you move on to the next point, and compare/contrast the two people again. This can continue for as many points as you'd like to discuss.

Intro

In the 1890s, the Ku Klux Klan terrorism and racial-segregation laws had basically taken over the south. The Civil War Reconstruction had failed to make sure that full rights had been granted to the freed slaves. African Americans desperately needed a way to respond to the white supremacists of that time. Two main advocates for the African American rights were Booker T. Washington and W. E. B. DuBois. While their methods may have differed, both of these men had a common goal in the uplift of the African American community.

Similarities Point #1

Both Washington and DuBois were highly intelligent who wrote about the disparities between the lives of the whites and blacks in the United States during the 19th and 20th centuries. They were considered leaders and both played pivotal roles in the Civil Right's movement. They worked against lynching and opposed racially motivated violence. Despite their share goal of racial and sociological equality, the two men had very different ideas about how equality would be achieved.

Approach Point #2

Booker T. Washington believed mainly in solving these problems through education. He believed in African Americans educating themselves through trades and investing in their own businesses. Proving to whites the value of their hard work could have an impact to the American economy. DuBois also believed in self-improvement through education. However, he believed that first they must get rid of segregation. DuBois criticized Washington's acceptance of racial segregation because he felt that it only encouraged whites to deny African American rights.
